



From 2004-2007 nofitstate toured their critically acclaimed production of ImMortal across the UK and Europe. This show gained cult status, won four awards for excellence, had sell out runs in nine different countries and played to over 105,000 people.

NoFit State Circus is pleased to present the second incarnation of tabú, developed and produced by the same creative team as the ImMortal project. Once again we experiment with promenade performance, ensuring that each member of the audience will enjoy a different experience.

Depending on where you stand and how much you actively explore, you are guaranteed a unique perspective on the spectacle. Don't be afraid to move around the tent to gain a better view, the stewards will guide you and keep you safe.

tabú- my fear and yours is a reworking of the first tabú project and has the same international cast as tabú -standing on the edge of the wilderness. This cast includes performers from Wales, Argentina, Australia, France, Italy, Finland and England, and brings some exciting new skills and some surprising new ensemble elements. We also welcome three new members to the Circus Orchestra. Breaking down barriers between the performers and their audience, tabú will ensure that nofitstate remains on the cutting edge of contemporary circus today.

Written and Directed by Firenza Guidi Director's Notes

The world is round like a bull-ring with a wide corridor that cuts the space in half and sharp lines slicing though thin air, dangerous but infinitely seductive. It is a cruel world, yet it is the only place where people learn to play. There is a strong community that lives there. No vivid colours have survived the dust. Just black and white and many shades of grey.

The story. It's been raining for 4 years, 11 months and 2 days. The world has come to low-voltage functioning. Not quite stopped, but everything works through a low energy. Stillness pervades the world inside the tent. An unforgiving calm hiding a storm. The world is asleep. The bodies, perfect relics of a time past, are hanging like cold meat: humanity parked in a kind of manageable storage-space where men and women live sedated, floating above the swamp. Without ups or downs without rebellions or revolutions. There is no darkness. No dark side. Only low-voltage brightness which induces a permanent state of torpor. Fear has made mankind close more and more: humans have become white, beautiful, sanitised flower-beds floating in air, no longer embroiled in the mud below. Soon everything and everybody will be absorbed by this smooth, gliding, almost mechanised world where people move about in circular rickshaws. But a young girl rips through the air like an earthquake to look through the shadows of her family lost in the swamps. Her name is Amaranta. Her mother spent her life enclosed, as if it was raining all the time; so the young girl spent hers crossing through to the other side of the rain, looking for a place to sleep among the clouds. With her arrival, the world cracks open like a gentle earthquake, becoming more jerky, rougher at the edges. Amaranta re-trains people in the art of "being". Unearthing their lives and past to exhume whatever sign of humanity might be buried in the bog-site. One by one, the family and the known faces of the remote swamp come back to life with their colours, their dances, their hang-ups, their laughter and their fears, raising their heads like raging bulls. Like archetypal figures they populate a world in which past, present and future co-exist. Amaranta lifts them one by one from their torments and obsessions. Her innocence and fearlessness counteract the dark pull of this scarred humanity. Through her journey she will dig and probe: Where does fear reside? Do we choose it or does it choose us? Amaranta becomes a woman and a predator. Finally, the very mechanisms that created the serene order of things where fear is sedated and silenced like the worst secret, become the instruments of the revolution. A revolution of the senses, where taste, touch, smell, sight and hearing become paramount in celebrating life's dirtiness and its embarrassingly fearful or irresistibly sensual side.




The idea Tabú is a new journey and exploration into the darker side of being. It looks at fear as a positive and negative force. Fear makes us breathe faster and forces our eyes to open wide but it can also make us use and abuse our power over others. Tabú isn't a freak show, it isn't voyeurism. It is the tissue we are made of and cannot fully grasp, let alone explain. Tabú digs deeper and deeper into human nature and whilst remaining firmly on the ground, probes into and soars around the very things wo/man has done but cannot talk about. These are tabú.

The Process. At the beginning there is a title, an idea, a vision and lots of questions. Then the environment begins to take shape as a design concept. Then the performers and creative team enter the vision with their different skills and personalities and cultures. Then a mentor appears by my side, to accompany and inspire me through my journey. This time it was Gabriel García Márquez. Particularly One hundred years of solitude. It was brilliant to see the book in at least 5 different languages dotted around the tent during rehearsals. The mentor, be it a novel or poem or film, is a constant source of inspiration while the montage of the show begins to take form. Ultimately, it is a total sensual experience. What the audience will feel is an energy, a music, a smell, a touch, a performer gazing right into their eyes as they search for clues. So, come and surrender to the velvet revolution.


